Section A

Schofield College is located on Norman Street in the city of Schofield in the English Midlands. The nearest airport is at Birmingham (35 miles). Schofield is approximately 100 miles from London. Schofield College is in the city centre, just a few minutes' walk from the train station. The number 4A bus stops outside, and links the college with the shopping centre and the main residential districts.

Section B

The college runs courses in a range of subjects. There are English language classes for international students who wish to apply for a place at a British university and need to take the IELTs test. The college also offers courses for people who want to learn how to do jobs like hairdressing, motor-vehicle maintenance and hotel work. Most of the courses begin in late September and run for nine months.

Section C

Many college students already live in Schofield with their families. But there is residential accommodation available on campus for international students and anyone who lives too far away to travel to college every day. The rooms are in self-catering apartments, with shared use of a bathroom and kitchen. Contact Fiona Delyn, the Accommodation Officer (delyn@schocoll.org), for more information.

Section D

The college has a well-equipped gym and fitness centre, which students can use free of charge, and there are tennis courts on campus, which can be booked for a small fee. The college also has both men's and women's football teams which play in the nearby park. The women's team won the inter-college championship last year.
